Preview: 1790 Cincinnati v. Detroit Waza Flo Pro

The Detroit Waza Flo Pro heads to Fairfield, Ohio for a Sunday night rematch with 1790 Cincinnati at the Game Time Training Center at 6:15 P.M.

Sunday's match will mark the second of five meetings between the clubs this year. Cincinnati won the first outing 9-4 in the inaugural PASL-Pro match for both teams on November 9. Cincinnati has not played since that night, while Detroit fell to 0-3 with a pair of losses in Colorado last weekend.

Hoping to turn its fortunes around, Waza will install forward Neil McGill into the line-up. Detroit hopes the burly target man will be a source of goals come Sunday night. "We brought in McGill because our point forwards have not been producing," midfielder Darryl Quinn said after training on Friday. "If McGill can provide us with some much needed offense and we cut down on our mistakes, then I believe we can have a very strong performance on Sunday."

Second forward Tommy Eller will also make his first appearance this weekend for Waza adding another huge boost to the front line. The former U-17 National Team player missed the first three games with a chipped bone in his foot but should be fit for Sunday.

The trip to Ohio will be the club's fourth of six consecutive road games to start the season. At 0-3 it is vital that Waza begin to steal points on the road so that the team does not open up its home portion of the schedule at Compuware Arena in an 0-6 hole. "Sunday is crucial for us," stated team owner Mario Scicluna, "but if we can put what we've worked on in practice into use during the game, then we are more than capable of coming away with all three points on Sunday."
