## Report: 1790 Cincinnati 9 - Detroit Waza Flo Pro 8

Despite being stranded on I-75 for four hours and the game kicking off while half the team was still in the lockerroom, Detroit Waza Flo Pro put in its best performance of the year, but fell just short 9-8 at the hands of 1790 Cincinnati.

The action started long before the match got underway when the Waza motorhome filled with smoke. With engine troubles sidelining Waza in Lima, Ohio the game needed to be pushed back from 6:15 to 8:00 P.M.

Nikki Djokic continued his scoring spree with two goals and both Kenyan international Kevin Ouma and target man Neil McGill scored on their debuts, but it wasn't enough as 1790 took advantage of two late penalties to finish on the winning end of the score-line.

Detroit had a chance to tie the game when awarded a corner kick with nine seconds left, but Cincinnati defended the set piece well, keeping Waza from getting a clean shot on goal.

"I'm really proud of the way our team played," head coach Dominic Scicluna said after the match. "We faced a lot of adversity today and still put in our best performance of the season. Despite our record [0-4], I really feel this team is moving in the right direction."
