



Detroit Waza will close out its six game road trip this weekend with back to back matches against the St. Louis Illusion (7 P.M. Friday) and the Springfield Spirits (6:15 P.M. Saturday).

With an 18 day lay-off following the heartbreaking 9-8 loss to 1790 Cincinnati, the Waza warriors are well rested and ready to get back to work. This weekend presents two more opportunities for the Motor City boys to break into the win column before finally getting the chance to play in front of their home fans at Compuware Arena.
