Report: 1790 Cincinnati 9 - Detroit Waza Flo Pro 1

1790 Cincinnati demolished an understaffed Detroit Waza Flo Pro team 9-1 at the Game Time Training Center in Fairfield, Ohio.

David Horne put Cincinnati up 1-0 early in the first quarter, but a good match looked to be on the cards as Darrel Quinn replied right away with a toe poke from inside the 1790 box.

Quinn's goal was all Waza could muster, however, as 1790 ran riot with a relentless attack. Jimmy Cummings led an evenly spread out score-chart with two goals. Older brother Jack Cummings got in on the act with an extraordinary back-heel goal, and player/coach Craigh Rhodis chipped in with a goal and four assists.

"It was just one of those nights where everything went wrong," head coach Dominic Scicluna lamented after the match. "We were very shorthanded, but that's no excuse. We made some very basic mistakes tonight and 1790 took full advantage."

To further compound Waza's misery, Scicluna was sent off early in the third quarter for arguing with the referee. Scicluna was already serving a one match ban for the red card he received in Springfield, and will now have to sit out yet another match.

The good news for Waza is that it gets another chance tomorrow night when it takes on the West Virginia Quantam Force in Hurricane, West Virginia. Waza must win to avoid going 0-8 on the road in its inaugural PASL-Pro season.

After West Virginia, Detroit will return home to play its final seven games in front of the Waza faithful at Compuware Arena.
