Report: Detroit Waza Flo Pro 13 v. Windsor Border Stars 9

The Detroit Waza Flo Pro defeated its neighbor and international rival, the Windsor Border Stars 13-9 at Compuware Arena.

Originally, Waza was supposed to face Saskatoon Accelerators (from Saskatchewan, Canada), but with the Accelerators competing in the final of the "Copa America" against Monterrey in Mexico, the Border Stars filled the slot as a more than adequate replacement.

In fact, this match was much more interesting not only because the Flo Pro and Border Stars are separated by a river and an international boundary, but also because many of the Waza players play for the Border Stars' outdoor team in the Canadian Professional Soccer League (CPSL).

On the turf, Waza raced out to an early 5-0 lead, only for the Canadians to roar back scoring the next three goals. Detroit never trailed but, Windsor did peg the Mo-town boys back to 8-7 late in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, however, Waza pulled away for the comfortable 13-9 victory.

Blake Ordell, Tommy Eller, Dominic Scicluna and Derek Gramabone each scored two goals for Waza and Ryan Mallord scored his first goal of the season against sixth attacker Luigj Djokic to cap off the afternoon.

Waza returns to action next Sunday night at 7:00 P.M. at Compuware Arena for its final game of the Inaugural PASL-Pro Season against the St. Louis Illusion. The match will be a fierce encounter as Waza looks to finish the season on a high note with its third consecutive victory. St. Louis, on the other hand, may need to win in order to grab the wild card birth to the PASL-Pro playoffs.
